

The Future of Diabetes Mellitus Management

Inpatient Blood Glucose Management Service associated with The Diabetes Center of Excellence at UMASS Worcester Medical Center. The world of diabetes management has changed over the last decade in many ways. Newer treatment options have emerged including different classes of diabetes medications to choose from such as GLP1 inhibitors, DPPIV inhibitors, and mixed options. There are newer formulations of insulin such as degludec, fisap, and admelog and many newer technologies to administer insulin more effectively including the closed loop insulin pump system, wireless continuous glucose monitors, talking meters etc. Access and costs for these innovations vary and it is vital that Nurse Practitioners are up to date with these products and treatment options to effectively guide the patients for a positive clinical outcome, incorporating the evidence-based practice. Being an informed provider, help us to advocate and ease the burden to effectively manage diabetes for our patients and reach goals that is attainable for each patient population with their lifestyle and other comorbidities in mind. Provider's awareness of the socioeconomic background and the educational level of each patient, along with the wide array of resources that are available to support the patient would be the best plan of care, thus keep them continually engaged with their diabetes management. As for providers, there are educational opportunities to advance their knowledge in treatment options, and practice modalities consistent with the latest guidelines in accordance with ADA and AACE thus help providers to determine the appropriate "next steps" in the diabetes management continuum.


